Mr. Pogue is organist at Community Church at Tellico Village after 20 years as organist at First Christian Church in Rockwood. Being naturally attracted to music, Mr. Pogue began piano lessons at age 9. His experience has covered many styles including Southern gospel, classical, and contemporary. He taught Spanish and theater arts at Roane County High School and studies organ with Brenda Goslee at Roane State Community College.

Mr. Duggin began piano studies also at age 9 while in fourth grade at a small country school. Following a career of music in organ, he studied organ at Belmont University and University of Memphis. Church music has served him professionally as a college teacher, a high school teacher, a Minister of Activities (Music and Education), Minister of Music and Youth, and twenty one years as organist with 16 years as Choir Master.

Both gentlemen are members of AGO (American

Guild of Organist), an organization which promotes the organ in its traditional and evolving role. Local, district, and national exposure have enlightened and inspired the personal love for the instrument.
